Term 4, PRC meeting was held on Monday 18th November at St Paul's Greystanes.

The speakers were the CEO of Catholic Schools Parramatta Diocese Jack DeGroot, PRC President, George Giovas and Vice President, Sharon Hader. They spoke about what the PRC is, how they plan to revitalise the group in 2025 and why the PRC is an important part of schools.

This was followed by Steve Batchelor, CSPD Family Engagement Officer – He outlined a current pilot program that is being trialled in about 15 CSPD schools. Called CAFE Club — an exciting and flexible alternative to P&Fs and parent groups for families!



The panel discussion of the evening was led by Dr Greg Elliot - Executive General Manager Quality and Performance CSPD, Anoushka Houseman – Wellbeing Leader, Santa Sophia College and Nicky Alsemgeest – Partnership Manager, St Columba College. They spoke on supporting our young people at every stage — from starting primary school to preparing for Year 12 and beyond.
